he security of our members' personal data is a top priority at SGS Co-op, which explains the need for the formal training of the entire staff at SGS Co-op in data protection by a competent external consultant.

SGS Co-op staff will attend an extensive five day workshop and delve into the management of personal data privacy and compliance risk. Our staff will also learn about topics including the latest updates on key legislative and regulatory requirements of the Personal Data Protection Act (PDPA) as well as organisations' required obligations and handling of personal data.

During the workshop, our staff will examine standards implemented by other organisations in this area and work closely with our appointed consultant to adapt the industry's best practices when developing SGS Co-op's own data inventory map and management processes.

Through this workshop, our staff will be equipped with the knowledge and skillsets to face the critical challenges ahead in safeguarding and managing members' personal data. SGS-Co-op

intends to attain the Data Protection Trust Mark Assured Certification in the near future.



### **Personal Mobility Devices (PMDs)** banned on footpaths

Following the ban of electric scooters (e-scooters) on footpaths since 5 Nov 2019, strict enforcements will begin from 1 Jan 2020. Those caught riding e-scooters on footpaths can be fined up

### **More Support for Couples** to Meet Parenthood **Aspirations**

From 1 Jan 2020, there will be no age limit for women to undergo assisted reproduction technology (ART) treatments and no cap on the number of ART cycles.

In addition, up to two of the six co-funded ART cycles can be carried

out after age 40, as long as the couple had attempted AR or Intra-Uterine Insemination (IUI) procedures before age 40. Government co-funding of up to 75%, capped at \$1,000 per treatment cycle for a maximum of three cycles, will also be available for eligible couples going through IUI at public assisted reproduction centres. ### Minimum Legal Age of Smoking Raised to 20

From 1 Jan 2020, the minimum legal age of smoking will be raised to 20. With the bill in effect, the use, purchase and possession of e-cigarettes will also be illegal. This follows MOH's commitment to lower the



prevalence of smoking and de-normalise smoking amongst youths here in Singapore. On 1 Jan 2021, the minimum legal age of smoking will be raised to 21.

### **Singapore Unveils Rearranged National Anthem**

To celebrate the 60<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the state crest, the flag and the anthem, a new rendition of the national anthem was unveiled on all Mediacorp, Singapore Press Holdings and SAFRA radio stations on 3 Dec 2019.

#### What's new in our new anthem?

- It is approximately 5 seconds shorter than the original recorded in 2001
- It is arranged in F major instead of G major - allows the majority of Singaporeans to sing the anthem with
  - It is of better sound quality reflects the improvements in audio recording since the 2000s and showcases the nuances of the music arrangement, especially in large venues with modern sound systems

# **CPF Retirement Sum Scheme** (RSS) Payouts to Last till 90

Starting from 2020, CPF RSS payouts will last until age 90, instead of 95. With the bill in place, eligible Singaporeans will be getting higher payouts each month. The new rules will be applied to RSS members who turn 65 from 1 Jul 2020, while RSS members currently receiving their payouts will see the change from 1 Jan 2020. RSS members can also opt for CPF Life (Lifelong income for the elderly) when they reach 65 or before they turn 80.

### Be Alert!

In light of scam activities happening in Singapore, the Ministry of Home Affairs posted a guide to identify scam tactics. Here is a quick summary in case you missed it:



Exercise caution when you come across bargains that are too good to be true, especially on online shopping platforms.

#### 2. Trusting People on the Internet

When purchasing something online such as Carousell, always make sure that the seller is verified.

#### 3. Unsolicited Text Messages

Moneylending services promoted through text messages are illegal as licensed moneylenders are not allowed to advertise their services through text.

### 4. Requesting for Personal Details

Since 1 Sept 2019, organisations are no longer allowed to collect an individual's NRIC number. Do not provide sensitive information such as your bank account number, contact numbers or your NRIC number to strangers.
