

Mr Tng Ah Yiam has been appointed Chairman of the Singapore National Cooperative Federation (SNCF). Previously SNCF's First Deputy Chairman, Mr Tng will continue to work closely with the board and management of SNCF to promote and develop the strategic direction of the Singapore Co-operative Movement in his new position.

Today, there are 64 affiliated co-operatives, including SGS Co-Op, which serve the needs of more than 1.4 million members in Singapore by providing affordable daily essentials, education and training, healthcare, financial services, recreation, and employment opportunities, as well as increasing inclusion of the less advantaged, such as the elderly and vulnerable.

Mr Tng is also the Chief Procurement Officer at FairPrice Group, comprising NTUC FairPrice Co-operative, NTUC Foodfare Co-operative, Kopitiam and NTUC Link.



UPDATES ON COVID-19 VACCINATION PROGRAMME

Covid-19 vaccination is offered free for all Singaporeans and long-term residents under the vaccination programme being rolled out in phases. More than 60,000 people have received their first dose. In addition, the second dose is being administered to those who have received their first dose.

> **PHASE I** Healthcare. frontline and essential workers

PHASE II Vulnerable and those with high-risk medical conditions

PHASE III Rest of the population

We are currently in Phase II which includes seniors 70 years and above. Seniors will be notified by mail to schedule an appointment for their vaccination from mid-February. To book an appointment, seniors can:

- register online at https://preregister. vaccine.gov.sg/,
- approach a community centre, or
- call Ministry of Health (MOH) Covid-19 Hotline at 1800-333-9999 for assistance.

Where to get vaccinated?

Currently the vaccination is being administered at 34 locations including selected polyclinics and Public Health Preparedness Clinics, as well as Changi Airport Terminal 4 and Raffles City Convention Centre. More centres will be planned to ensure those who are eligible can receive their vaccinations conveniently.

Is the second dose important?

The current Pfizer Inc-BioNTech vaccine available in Singapore requires two doses to be taken be taken at least 21 days apart. The Moderna vaccine, which will be rolled out from March onwards, will require two doses to be taken 28 days apart. The recommended dosage is based on clinical trials and scientific data. If you missed your second dose, you can call MOH Covid-19 Hotline to reschedule an appointment. Slight delays should not affect the protection offered by the vaccine.

Integrated Shield Plans will Cover Hospitalisation Resulting from Vaccine Complications

Several common side effects from Covid-19 vaccinations have been reported which are similar to other vaccines, such as pain, redness and swelling at the injection site, fever, chills, headache, muscle pine, joint pain, tiredness and



swollen lymph nodes. These side effects typically resolve within three days with rest or with paracetamol.

In very rare cases, the vaccine may cause severe allergic reaction with symptoms such as difficulty in breathing, swelling of the face, throat, eyes or lips, quickened heartbeat and dizziness. Those who experience such symptoms should seek medical attention immediately. MediShield Life is claimable for Covid-19 vaccination related complications.

IRIS AND FACIAL BIOMETRICS TO REPLACE FINGERPRINTS FOR IMMIGRATION CLEARANCE

All automated and manual immigration lanes and counters across Singapore's land, sea and air checkpoints have been equipped with iris and facial scanners. Iris patterns and facial features will replace fingerprints as the primary biometric identifiers for immigration clearance. Singapore citizens who hold a K-series passport or have enrolled their iris and facial biometrics will be able to use these automated immigration lanes. With these machines, travellers are advised not to wear coloured or patterned contact lenses.

ACCOUNT-BASED EZ-LINK CARDS ALLOW TOP-UPS VIA MOBILE APP

New account-based EZ-Link cards can now be topped up through a mobile application. Through the app, you can track your expenses on your EZ-Link cards, earn rewards and continue to use the card for payments, except for ERP and carpark charges. You can add several cards to your account and top up the card balance of your linked cards through the app. The card balance and trip fares will not show on bus

BICYCLES USED ON ROADS AND PATHS MUST HAVE BRAKES IN FUTURE

The Ministry of Transport (MOT) has accepted the Active Mobility Advisory Panel's (AMAP) fourth review to promote the safe use of active mobility devices. This include making it mandatory for all bicycles to have brakes installed when used on public paths and roads in future. MOT is also reviewing the effectiveness for mobility users to be covered by third-party liability insurance. More details will be announced in due course.

BE MONEY SMART! Tips from SGS Co-Op

Tips to Maximise CPF

1. Ensure that there is at least \$60,000 savings in your Ordinary and Special Accounts

Even if you are using your Ordinary Account to pay for your house, ensure that the balances in your Ordinary and Special Account add to at least \$60,000, to earn an extra 1% on the \$60,000. CPF members 55 years and above enjoy an additional 1% interest (up to 6%) for the first \$30,000 of their combined CPF balances.

2. Make Cash Refunds for CPF Savings Used for Property

If you come into some money, you can choose to make partial or full cash refunds of your CPF savings that you had previously withdrawn to pay for your property plus the interest accrued on them. This will help reduce the total interest you have to pay. Some people wrongly believed that they had to wait for their property to be sold. You can do this even when your property is not sold.

3. **Do CPFTop-Ups in January**

If you intend to top-up your CPF, schedule these top-ups at the start of the year to earn more interest. Topping up in January every year instead of December could earn you 20% more interest on your CPF savings over a span of 10 years.

4. Open CPF Special Account for Children

You can contribute monies into your child's or grandchild's Special

Account and make use of the long time horizon. For wealthier members, you can contribute up to the prevailing full retirement sum (\$186,000) into a newborn's Special Account at one go. With the power of compounding interest, this amount will become more than \$1.6 million in 55 years. Of course, this assumes no policy changes and requires you to lock away funds for 55 years.
