WHAT'S ON:



Celebrating festivals are usually the times when we feast. Good food with good company – a perfect combination for a joyous occasion. With Hari Raya Puasa coming soon, we ask our member to share some of their favourite recipes. Retired Mdm Jamilah Toha , 71 years, shares with us her recipe for curry puff (also known as Epok Epok or karipap pusing) – Singaporeans' favourite snack! Want more spice in your life? Add more chillis! Or choose to bake instead of deep-fry for a healthier option.

Ingredients

- 150g boneless skinless chicken (diced)
- 430g potatoes peeled (diced)
- 1/2 small brown onion (diced)
- Chilli mixture: Pound or blend the ingredients together:
- o 2 bay leaves for chill
- o 4 teaspoon curry powder
- o 1/2 teaspoon turmeric powder

- o 5 shallots
- o 50g dried red chilli (optional for spice)
- ½ teaspoon salt
- 500g all-purpose flour
- 1 ¼ cup water
 1 teaspoon salt
 - (for dough wrap)
- 1/3 cup + 3 tbsp

Filling

- . Heat skillet and sauté onion until soft.
- 2. Add chicken and stir fry until they jus changed colour.
- Add potatoes, mixed vegetables, and chili mixture. Continue to cook for about 5 minutes.
- Stir in chicken broth. Cover and let mixture simmer for about 5 minutes or until potatoes are soft.
- 5. Open the cover and sprinkle in the flour. This will help the mixture become stickier and make it easier to wrap.
- 6. Transfer the mixture into a bowl and let filling cool down before wrapping.

Dough Wrap

- 1. Whisk all-purpose flour and salt together in a large mixing bowl.
- 2. Make a well in the middle.
- 3. In a saucepan, heat 1/3 cup and 3 tablespoon vegetable oil on high heat. Once it bubbles, pour the hot oil into the flour well.
- 4. Allow the oil to bubble for a minute, then mix the flour and oil.
- Add water and knead the mixture until you get a very oiled ball of dough.
- 6. Divide the dough into small balls. Each ball should fit into your palm. You should be able to get 25 balls.

Wrapping

- . Flatten out each ball by rolling it out into a circular shape.
- Place about 1 tablespoon of the filling into the center of the circle and fold the dough up.
- Seal the puff by pressing or pinching the edges together. Make sure it's completely sealed
- Once all puffs are wrapped, you can choose to deep fry or bake them.

To Deep Fry: Remember to wait until the oil is hot and bubbles appear before putting in the puffs. It should take about 2

golden brown.

To Bake: Preheat oven to 350F. Line a baking sheet with a parchment paper. Brush the curry puffs with some egg wash and bake for about 25-30 minutes until golden brown.



The Climate Friendly Households Programme (CFHP) will expand to include all HDB households from 15 April 2024. Under the programme, each household will receive \$300 climate-friendly vouchers which can be used to purchase 10 types of energy- and water-efficient household products with new additions such as direct current fans, washing machines, and water closets. The vouchers will be valid until 31 December 2027.

This is to enable households to be more efficient in their use of energy and water. To use the Climate Vouchers, log on to RedeemSG (go.gov.sg/ cv-claim) with your Singpass account and present the vouchers with proof od address at the participating retail outlets.

ENHANCED MID-CAREER SUPPORT WITH **SkillsFuture**

Level-Up Programme



From 1 May 2024, a SkillsFuture Credit (Mid-Career) top-up of \$4,000 will allow all Singaporeans 40 and above to receive subsidies for publicly-funded fulltime diploma or about 7,000 selected courses that have 'better employability outcomes' with no expiry date for the credit.

These courses support substantive upskilling and reskilling to help Singaporeans pursue a substantive skill reboot and stay relevant in a changing economy. Younger Singaporeans will also receive this credit when they turn 40.

Eligible courses also include SkillsFuture Career Transition Programmes (SCTP) which are train-and-place programmes in sectors with good hiring opportunities. The full list of eligible courses can be viewed from 22 April 2024.

Retirement and Re-employment Age to rise from 1 July 2026 From 1 July 2026, the retirement age in Singapore will be 64 and the re-employment age will be 69. Companies must offer eligible staff re-employment until that age, though on adjusted terms if necessary, or offer employment assistance in its place.

BE MONEY SMART

Buy Now Pay Later

Have you heard of Grab Pay, Atome, LatitudePay, SeaMoney and ShopBack? These are "buy now, pay later" (BNPL) services offering "no-interest" or "hidden fee" instalment plans. But, what's the catch?

These payment schemes seem to make your purchase more affordable. Instead of buying a laptop for \$3,000 outright, you can now spread the large payment over three smaller payments of \$1,000 instead. This payment option helps you to stick to your budget so you don't overspend In fact, not all such deals are cheaper. You may not get the in a month. You won't need an overdraft or incur interest item for a discount and instead, end up paying more due loans if you need to purchase the item. to late payment fees should you miss a payment! So, be very careful and think twice before using BNPL services!

However, such schemes tend to work on the fear of missing out (FOMO) to lure customers to buy now, to "secure the deal". Therefore, you need to be very clear about when to use **BNPL**
