SASCO

ay 'SASCO' and most people would probably think of the SASCO Senior Citizens' Home in Hong San Terrace. But not many people are aware that SASCO is also part of the cooperative movement in Singapore.

Known in full as the Singapore Amalgamated Services Co-operative Organisation Ltd, SASCO was founded in 1933 by 12 thrift and loan cooperatives—including SGSCC. Its initial objective was to serve as a coordinating body, facilitating the coordination, collaboration and dissemination of information among local cooperatives.

In 1980, SASCO began providing affordable community and social development programmes to make a difference in people's lives.









SERVING SOCIETY

SASCO's community work began quietly. Acknowledging Singapore's ageing population, it first established the SASCO Senior Citizens' Home in 1981. The centre, originally located in the void deck of a HDB flat in Telok Blangah Rise, catered to just five elderly folk at the time. As demand for its services grew steadily, the home was relocated to larger premises in Hong San Terrace in 2006, where it can now host up to 102 needy seniors.

The Telok Blangah Rise premises became home to SASCO DACE in 2008. In 2012, SASCO DACE was designated as a Dementia Day Care Centre by the Ministry of Health.

With the strong support of SGSCC and other affiliated cooperatives, SASCO was able to expand its community offerings. The SASCO Child Care Centre in Bukit Purmei was officially opened in 1992. Just three years later, a second centre was founded in Bedok to better support working mothers.

In 1999, SASCO founded Hong Kah North Day Care Centre to offer rehabilitation and health monitoring services to frail and lower-income elderly, many of whom suffer from hypertension, stroke, diabetes, dementia and depression.

It also went on to form SASCO Integrated Eldercare Centre at West Coast Road to serve the community.

Today, SGSCC continues to support the good work that SASCO does. Many SGSCC Committee members, including Chairman Mr John Raghavan, Vice Chairman Mr Lim Huan Chiang and Committee Members Mr S Mohan and Mr Tan Pin Cheow, hold Management Committee responsibilities in SASCO.

Visitors from Philippines



n 5 February 2016, SGSCC was pleased to welcome 11 representatives from Dasmarinas City Employees Multi-Purpose Cooperative and the Cooperative Union of Cavite. Dasmarinas is the largest city in the province of Cavite, located south of Manila in the Philippines.

This was part of a learning visit, through which the Philippine representatives hoped to understand the best practices of Singapore cooperatives. Of particular interest was the implementation of good governance, which they believe is

a key success factor of Singapore cooperatives.

The Philippine delegation included the Chairperson, Vice Chairperson, six Board of Directors, a member and a staff manager of Dasmarinas City Employees Multi-Purpose Cooperative as well as an Executive Officer from the Cooperative Union of Cavite. After spending half a day with Singapore National Cooperative Federation, the representatives visited SGSCC's office in Peace Centre. They were particularly keen to benchmark themselves against SGSCC in numerous ways, including credit and savings approach,

management and governance, membership relations, officer commitment as well as social and corporate responsibility efforts.

As the oldest cooperative in Singapore, SGSCC was delighted to share its experience and expertise in this area. In the process, SGSCC also learnt more about the cooperative movement in the Philippines as well as the unique challenges and opportunities facing cooperatives in the fellow ASEAN nation. The visit was certainly an excellent way to exchange knowledge and built cross-border bonds.
